Local community members effectively advocated to local developers, politicians, as well as the Philadelphia Housing Authority (PHA), for this honor. Mr. Webb, the proud owner of Webb's Department Store, a record shop that sold everything from albums to CDs to record needles to all things music, passed away on November 23, 2017. Best known for his activism. love of his fellow man, mentorship, and the huge behind-the-scenes role he played in the Civil Rights Movement, Bruce Webb shared and received love from many. And speaking of Yo Yo, her comment perfectly summed up the evening. It was a like a class reunion, a gathering of old friends and legends, a celebration of shared history and the remarkable journey of a genre that had come to shape the world of music as we know it.

But among the exuberant celebration, an enduring narrative was beautifully woven. Media veteran Shelly Shell Williams joined forces with India Alston, the bright, curious, and impressively talented 16year-old daughter of Charlie the longevity of hip-hop. Mack. With Shelly's wisdom guiding her, India, armed with a keen sense of understanding, was tasked with documenting the monumental event, her interviews brilliantly bridging the generational gap between classic and newschool hip hop. This profound mentormentee relationship reflected the evening's spirit, symbolizing the unbroken continuum of hip-hop's past, present, and future. As we honor the 50-year journey of hip hop, let's also celebrate the assurance of its future, safeguarded by passionate young talents like India Alston under the watchful eye of legends. 

Hosts Mike Howard and Shelly Shell Williams, known for her work on Ur-




